



Winston's Challenge Intersection Collections Conditions

Intersection collections involves collecting donations from drivers in a manner which is safe and does not endanger either yourself, other workers/volunteers, drivers or members of the public. It is therefore imperative that we follow a number of safety guidelines which are enforced by Victoria Police.

These include:

1. Only collecting at traffic lights whilst the lights are red facing the cars in which you wish to collect donations from, and remaining off the road whilst the lights are green;
2. Not collecting whilst it is raining or during abnormal weather conditions;
3. Ensuring that there is a sign that is visible to drivers at all times whilst the collection is taking place (the supervisor is responsible for setting up the intersection);
4. Other conditions as stipulated on the attached permit conditions
5. Following the directions of site supervisors and members of the police force.

Volunteers/collectors are also advised to:

1. Wear loose comfortable clothing for the day;
2. Suitable enclosed footwear. Thongs or open toed footwear is not acceptable.
3. Bring with them at least 2 litres of water (or other suitable drinks. Caffeinated or energy drinks are not recommended);
4. Hat and sunscreen (and sunglasses if possible).

It is expected that all collectors are to be polite and courteous whilst representing Rabbit Run-Away Orphanage. Abusive, threatening or other behaviours which may bring the fundraising program into disrepute will not be tolerated. All equipment is also to be returned at the end of the day to the supervisor.

Please also refer to the attached document *Highway Collection Permit Conditions*. If at any times in doubt during the collection, please seek advice of the supervisor.
